

Case ( <i>noun function</i> )	English preposition	Singular case ending
Nominative ( <i>subject</i> )	The / —	-a
Genitive ( <i>possession</i> )	Of / 's	-ae
Dative ( <i>Indirect Object</i> )	To / for	-ae
Accusative ( <i>Direct Object</i> )	The / —	-am
Ablative ( <i>Object of a preposition</i> )	By / with / from	-ā
Vocative ( <i>Direct address</i> )	Oh! / —	-a
