



Quick Notes on Classes of Verbs:

1. **Transitive Verbs:** always have an objective element and tells what or whom the subject is acting on in a sentence.
A transitive verb is the bridge that connects the subject and direct object.
2. **Linking Verbs:** join the subject to the predicate like an equal sign.
3. **Intransitive Verbs:** are predicate verbs that express action (like a transitive verb) but DOES NOT have an objective element (a direct object).
4. **Helping Verbs:** helps other verbs express their meaning. It's placed alongside a transitive, intransitive or linking verb to form a verb phrase.
