## Intensive Day 4

1. Predicate Nominative: a noun or pronoun that follows a \_\_\_\_\_ verb and renames the \_\_\_\_\_.

2. Linking Verbs: connect \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ by expressing a state of being.
3. Compound Noun (aka Compound Word): a noun made up of two or more words that are treated as one word (ex. footsteps, Cherry Tree Lane). These are analyzed and diagrammed as one word.

Example: The stars (*subject*) are (*linking verb*) gold (*adjective*) paper (*predicate nominative*).

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### ANALYZING AND DIAGRAMMING:

1. Determine the subject; underline it and place a capital letter S above the subject.)
2. Double underline ONLY the linking verb.
3. Place a capital letter P over the predicate (noun).
4. The predicate (noun) renames the subject, so place a N to the right of the letter P.
5. Above the linking verb, place the lowercase letters lv.
6. Identify and label modifiers (adverbs & adjectives) from right to left in the sentence using lines, arrows and placing either adj or adv in the elbow.
